ISSUE: Fiscal Year 2024 Unified Planning Work Program and Budget Final Draft

REPORT and VOTE: Consider approval of the FY 2024 Unified Planning Work Program and budget.

BACKGROUND:

MPO staff has developed the *Fiscal Year 2024 Unified Planning Work Program* (FY 2024 UPWP) and budget, which documents all planning activities the MPO will perform from July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024. The MPO Technical Committee and Executive Committee voted to send the draft FY 2024 UPWP to the Iowa Department of Transportation (DOT) at their March meetings. The MPO must submit the final UPWP to the Iowa DOT by June 1, 2023.

A copy of the draft FY UPWP and budget is available on the MPO website (click to access).

Updates made to the final FY 2024 UPWP include the following:

- Per Iowa DOT's recommendation, added Planning Emphasis Areas to the Requirements section, and noted which emphasis areas are addressed in the Planning Activities section.
- Per Iowa DOT's recommendation, added Complete Streets Policy update and Complete Streets Prioritization Plan into Task 2a.
- Per Iowa DOT's recommendation, noted that Safe Streets for All funds shown in Table 1
 and Table 10 will not be part of the planning agreement between the MPO and the Iowa
 DOT, as those funds will have their own agreement between FHWA and the MPO.
- Removed Watershed Management as an activity under Task 4.
- Removed staff supervision from the services the MPO provides to MIPA in Task 8.
- Reduced staff hours to the MIPA contract to account for dropping supervisor support.
- Updated Table 5's list of non-personnel costs to increase costs for ESRI software and telecommunications, and to decrease software costs, to be more consistent with actual costs observed in FY 2023.
- Updated the indirect rate and associated tables to reflect updates to Table 5.
- Removed cost for Greenlowa Americorps in Table 5.
- Increased summer intern hours.
- Updated Water Trails grant and match funds available to date in Table 2 and Table 11.

ISSUE: Federal Fiscal Year 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program Development

REPORT: Report on the process to develop the *Federal Fiscal Years 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program*.

BACKGROUND:

MPO staff is required to develop a four-year Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) by updating the current TIP for the MPO. The purpose of the TIP is to list all projects in the MPO planning area proposed to receive federal funding and scheduled to begin within the next four federal fiscal years.

MPO staff requested that MPO member governments and participating agencies review and report any project changes, new projects, or "roll-over" projects programmed in Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2023, 2024, 2025, 2026, and/or 2027. Staff developed the project listing for the FFY 2024-2027 TIP with the information provided by the member governments.

MPO staff will submit the FFY 2024-2027 TIP draft to the Iowa Department of Transportation (DOT) and Federal Highway Administration for review and comment on June 15, 2023. Staff will incorporate any comments received into the final draft. The final FFY 2024-2027 TIP is due to the Iowa DOT by July 15, 2023.

The Draft FFY 2024-2027 Project List will be provided prior to the May meeting.

ISSUE: Charging & Fueling Infrastructure Discretionary Grant Program

REPORT: Report on Charging and Fueling Infrastructure (CFI) Discretionary Grant Program

BACKGROUND:

The <u>Charging & Fueling Infrastructure (CFI) Discretionary Grant Program</u> Notice of Funding was released in March 2023.

This initial funding of up to \$700 million will be available to deploy EV charging infrastructure and other alternative fueling infrastructure projects in urban and rural communities in publicly accessible locations through the CFI Discretionary Grant Program.

The CFI Discretionary Grant Program was established by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law and will provide up to \$2.5 billion over five years to a full range of applicants, including cities, counties, local governments, and Tribes.

This round of funding applications are due by May 30.

MPO staff has been working with member communities key EV staff to identify sites for Level 2 charger installations and will submit a regional grant application for this program.

MPO staff has arranged a work session with MidAmerican Energy & Iowa Clean Cities Coalition that all jurisdictions are welcome to attend on May 4th from 11:30am – 1pm at the DMAMPO office. During this time, jurisdiction representatives and utility staff can work to determine ideal locations on specific sites as well as cost estimates for utility extensions, and more.

MPO staff will provide an update on outcomes of the May 4th work session and progression of the grant application in May MPO Committee meetings.

ISSUE: SFY 2024 State Recreational Trails (SRT) Notice for Upcoming Grant Round

REPORT: Report on State Recreational Trails (SRT) Upcoming Funding Round

BACKGROUND:

The State Recreational Trails (SRT) Upcoming Funding Round Notice was released in late April 2023.

The State Recreational Trails Program (SRT) and Federal Recreational Trails Program (FRT) provide funding opportunities for the establishment and improvement of recreational trails in Iowa. The SRT program aims to provide public access and enjoyment of recreational trails throughout the state, with funding available for acquisition, construction, or improvement of trails open to the public or those intended to be dedicated to public use upon completion. Eligible applicants include state and local government agencies, municipal corporations, counties, and non-profit organizations. However, private businesses and developers are not permitted to apply directly for funding from this program.

Similarly, the FRT program provides grants for recreational trails and trail-related projects, with funding intended for maintenance and restoration of existing trails, development of trailside and trailhead facilities, construction of new trails (with restrictions on federal lands), and acquisition of easements or property for trails. Additionally, the program permits operation of educational programs to promote safety and environmental protection related to trails, limited to 5 percent of a state's funds. Eligible applicants for FRT program funds include federal, state, and local government agencies, as well as private individuals and organizations, if co-sponsored by a government agency.
