FY 2024 UPWP and Budget Development

- MPO Requirements per US Code
 - Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)
 - Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP)
 - Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)
 - Public Participation Plan (PPP)
- Additional MPO Requirements
 - Congestion Management Process (required of TMAs)
 - Must have decision making bodies (e.g., MPO Policy Committee)
 - Administer STBG funding process

FFY 2024-2027 TIP Development

- MPO develops a four-year Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) annually
- MPO member governments and associated agencies receive current TIP projects for review and update
- Federally funded FFY 2023 programmed projects must have FHWA authorization to proceed by September 30th 2023
- If not, a rollover to FFY 2024 is required
- Staff will be sending out the TIP status reports on March 10th



DC LIST AND COMMUNITY PROJECTS



Annual DC List

- DMDC 2023, the annual trip to Washington DC organized by the Greater Des Moines Partnership, is May 10-12.
- MPO is working with member governments to develop a list of priority transportation projects to be discussed with Iowa's Congressional delegation.
- This year, the DC list is returning to its roots and including only projects that are actively seeking funding, along with any important policy initiatives.

A proposed new facility would include a maintenance building, bus storage and an office building, and would alleviate flooding concerns, allow for expand use of electric vehicles and improve overall safety and operational efficient.
