FY 2024 UPWP and Budget Final Draft

- MPO's scope of work for next fiscal year
 - Work elements and activities
 - Committees
 - Costs

Proposed work activities are tied to the MPO's federal requirements

Draft submitted to DOT April 1st - Final due June 1st



FY 2024 UPWP and Budget Development

- MPO Requirements per US Code
 - Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)
 - Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP)
 - Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)
 - Public Participation Plan (PPP)
- Additional MPO Requirements
 - Congestion Management Process (required of TMAs)
 - Must have decision making bodies (e.g., MPO Policy Committee)
 - Administer STBG funding process



FY 2024 UPWP and Budget Development

- New or Notable projects identified:
 - Long-Range Transportation Plan update
 - Travel Model Update
 - Growth Scenario
 - Planning Area Boundary Adjustment
 - Comprehensive Safety Action Plan (Safe Streets for All grant)
 - Goods Movement Study update
 - Refined Greenhouse Gas analysis at corridor level and other scales
 - Carbon Reduction Strategy development & implementation
 - Innovative transportation funding



FY 2024 UPWP and Budget Development

- Updates from draft approved in March:
 - Addressed Iowa DOT recommendations
 - Add discussion of FHWA/FTA emphasis areas
 - Added more detail to Complete Streets work element
 - Noted Safe Streets for All funds are separate DOT agreement
 - Removed watershed management activities from Task 4
 - Removed staff supervision from MIPA contract
 - Updated budgetary information to reflect actual costs
 - Removed Greenlowa Americorps and added summer intern hours
 - Updated Water Trails BUILD Grant info



FFY 2024-2027 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT



FFY 2024-2027 TIP Development

- MPO develops a four-year Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) annually
- MPO member governments and associated agencies receive current TIP projects for review and update
- Federally funded FFY 2023 programmed projects must have FHWA authorization to proceed by September 30th 2023
- If not, a rollover to FFY 2024 is required
- Staff will be sending out the TIP status reports on March 10th


Charging & Fueling Infrastructure Discretionary Grant Program

- Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) released in March 2023
 - \$700 million available this cycle, and \$2.5 billion over five years
- Eligible Fuels
 - Electric, Hydrogen, Natural Gas (Compressed, Liquified), Propane (limited to medium and heavy vehicles)
- Two grants available
 - Community Charging and Fueling Grants ("Community Program")
 - Prioritizes rural areas, low/moderate income neighborhoods, low private parking/high multiunit dwellings
 - Award size \$500,000 \$15 million
 - May contract with a private entity
 - Alternative Fuel Corridor Grants ("Corridor Program")
 - Projects must be along designated Alternative Fuel Corridors (AFC)
 - Award size \$1 million and above
 - Must contract with a private entity, who is responsible for all non-federal share
 - 80% federal / 20% local
 - Applications will be considered for both grant programs and may be awarded under both
- Project Merit Criteria
 - Safety, Climate Change/Resilience/Sustainability, Equity/Community Engagement/Justice 40, Workforce Development/Job Quality/Wealth Creation, CFI Program Vision
- Applications due May 30, 2023



Charging & Fueling Infrastructure Discretionary Grant Program

- MPO staff is putting together regional joint application for Community Charging Program
 - 1st of 5 years for this program
 - CIRTPA & Ames MPO coordination
- All MPO communities contacted, many in progress
 - Connect with MidAmerican for utility extension costs
 - May Council resolutions
 - Add sites to online mapping tool
 - Submit final site proposals to MPO staff ASAP
- Discussion today:

State Recreation Trail Funding Announcement

- Notice for the State Recreational Trails (SRT)
- SRT provides funds to establish recreational trails throughout lowa for the use, enjoyment and participation of the public
- Restricted to the acquisition, construction or improvement of recreational trails open for public use
- Final programming has not been appropriated by legislature however applications are now open
- Deadline to apply is July 1, 2023

Notice of Funding Opportunity: PROTECT

- FHWA's 1st round of the Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-Saving Transportation (PROTECT)
 Discretionary Grant Program is now open
 - Aims to enable surface transportation to be more resilient to natural hazards, including climate change, sea level rise, flooding, extreme weather events, and other natural disasters.
 - Up to \$848 million in Fiscal Year 2022 and 2023.
 - Virtual meetings next week
- Applications due August 18, 2023



Updated logo for new MPO website
