Discussed the no right turn on red effort. MPO will create a public input map for roundtable members to input intersection locations. At future meetings we will discuss the proposed intersections and compile a list of proposed intersections for each member jurisdiction to evaluate and potentially implement a no right turn on red. We also discussed regional trail counters and discussed a hybrid strategy. The proposal is to reduce the number of permanent trail counters in our expansion efforts and contract with a Big Data solution to supplement our trail usage data efforts.
